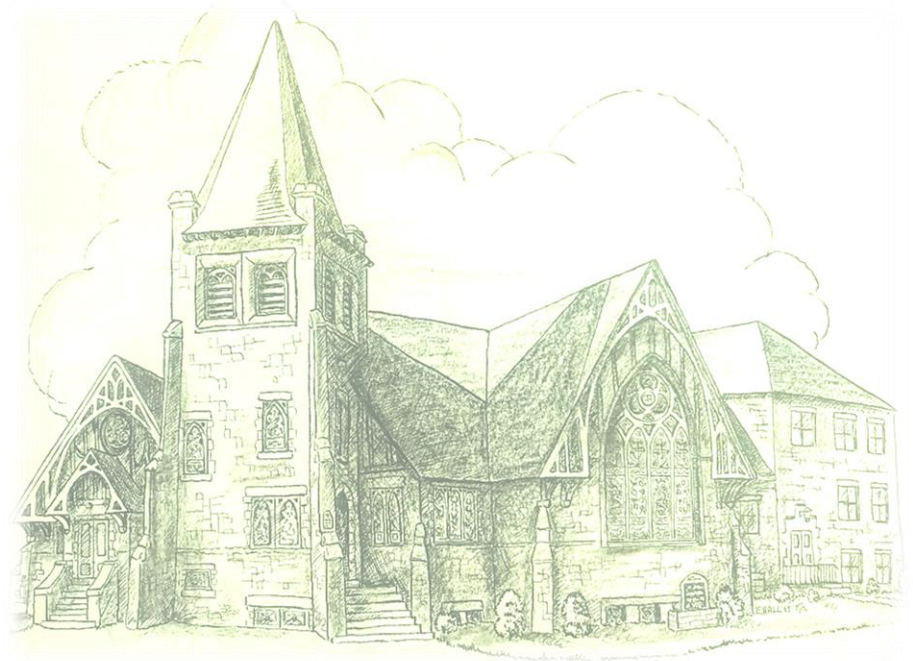

Scripture Lesson
John 17:11b-19

^{11b} ...Holy Father, keep them in your name, which you have given me, that they may be one, even as we are one. ¹² While I was with them, I kept them in your name, which you have given me. I have guarded them, and not one of them has been lost except the son of destruction, that the Scripture might be fulfilled. ¹³ But now I am coming to you, and these things I speak in the world, that they may have my joy fulfilled in themselves. ¹⁴ I have given them your word, and the world has hated them because they are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁵ I do not ask that you take them out of the world, but that you keep them from the evil one. ¹⁶ They are not of the world, just as I am not of the world. ¹⁷ Sanctify them in the truth; your word is truth. ¹⁸ As you sent me into the world, so I have sent them into the world. ¹⁹ And for their sake I consecrate myself, that they also may be sanctified in truth.

Psalm 68: 1-20 (ESV) Responsive Reading

¹God shall arise, his enemies shall be scattered;
and those who hate him shall flee before him!

²As smoke is driven away, so you shall drive them away;
as wax melts before fire, so the wicked shall perish before God!

³But the righteous shall be glad; they shall exult before God;
they shall be jubilant with joy!

⁴Sing to God, sing praises to his name; lift up a song to him who rides through the deserts;
his name is the Lord; exult before him!

⁵He is a Father of the fatherless and protector of widows
God in his holy habitation.

⁶God settles the solitary in a home; he leads out the prisoners to prosperity,
but the rebellious dwell in a parched land.

⁷O God, when you went out before your people,
when you marched through the wilderness,

⁸the earth quaked, the heavens poured down rain,
before God, the One of Sinai, before God, the God of Israel.

⁹Rain in abundance, O God, you shed abroad;
you restored your inheritance as it languished;

¹⁰your flock found a dwelling in it;
in your goodness, O God, you provided for the needy.

¹¹The Lord gives the word;
the women who announce the news are a great host:

¹²“The kings of the armies—they flee, they flee!”
The women at home divide the spoil—

¹³though you men lie among the sheepfolds—
the wings of a dove covered with silver, its pinions with shimmering gold.

¹⁴When the Almighty scatters kings there,
let snow fall on Zalmon.

¹⁵O mountain of God, mountain of Bashan;
O many-peaked mountain, mountain of Bashan!

¹⁶Why do you look with hatred, O many-peaked mountain,
at the mount that God desired for his abode,
yes, where the Lord will dwell forever?

¹⁷The chariots of God are twice ten thousand, thousands upon
thousands;
the Lord is among them; Sinai is now in the sanctuary.

¹⁸You ascended on high, leading a host of captives in your train
and receiving gifts among men,
even among the rebellious, that the Lord God may dwell there.

¹⁹Blessed be the Lord, who daily bears us up;
God is our salvation.

²⁰He is our God, the God from whom salvation comes;
God is the Lord, by whom we are delivered from death.

ACTS 1: 15-26 (ESV)

¹⁵In those days Peter stood up among the brothers (the company of persons was in all about 120) and said, ¹⁶“Brothers, the Scripture had to be fulfilled, which the Holy Spirit spoke beforehand by the mouth of David concerning Judas, who became a guide to those who arrested Jesus. ¹⁷For he was numbered among us and was allotted his share in this ministry.” ¹⁸(Now this man acquired a field with the reward of his wickedness, and falling headlong he burst open in the middle and all his bowels gushed out. ¹⁹And it became known to all the inhabitants of Jerusalem, so that the field was called in their own language Akeldama, that is, Field of Blood.)

²⁰ “For it is written in the Book of Psalms,
“May his camp become desolate,
and let there be no one to dwell in it’;
And “Let another take his office.’

²¹So one of the men who have accompanied us during all the time that the Lord Jesus went in and out among us, ²²beginning from the baptism of John until the day when he was taken up from us—one of these men must become with us a witness to his resurrection.” ²³And they put forward two, Joseph called Barsabbas, who was also called Justus, and Matthias. ²⁴And they prayed and said, “You, Lord, who know the hearts of all, show which one of these two you have chosen ²⁵to take the place in this ministry and apostleship from which Judas turned aside to go to his own place.” ²⁶And they cast lots for them, and the lot fell on Matthias, and he was numbered with the eleven apostles.

We believe in one God, the Father Almighty,

and the third day he rose again, according to the Scriptures;

And we believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord and Giver of life;
who proceeds from the Father and the Son;
who with the Father and the Son together is worshipped and
glorified;
who spoke by the prophets.
And we believe in one holy catholic¹ and apostolic church.
We acknowledge one baptism for the remissions of sins;
And we look for the resurrection of the dead,
And the life of the world to come. Amen.

¹ "Catholic" means universal: that is, there is one church across all times, places, and peoples.
