

BOOK REVIEW

"Forward" by David Jeremiah is a book that points to the discovery of God's plan for seizing tomorrow. The fly leaf says, "Your best days are not behind you! Now more than ever God is ready to use you, and your greatest moment could be only a step away. It doesn't matter who you are or what your age or your current situation may be – God will strengthen you, fulfill you, and partner with you to see great things accomplished in your lifetime." He admonishes us like Paul to forget those things which are behind and reach forward to those things which are ahead (Phil. 3:13). This is a good read and will be in our church library soon.

Thomas Rodrigues

Thomas Rodrigues works with CRU, an organization that interacts with college students, sharing the Gospel with them and developing friendships and support avenues. Universal Bible Sunday December 14, 1941

"It has been most appropriate that this week of America's entry into World War II should have been observed as Bible Week. At no time in history has there been a greater need to turn to the Gospel for comfort and guidance". - From the "Bible Week" editorial in the Binghamton Press [Saturday] December 13, 1941, pg.6.

"Universal Bible Sunday" just happened to be on December 14, 1941, exactly one week after the Japanese bombed Pearl Harbor. Several days earlier the U.S. declared war against Japan on December 8, 1941.

How the church reacted to such important historic events is always of interest. In our history collection we have several binders of Rev. John Sivewright's Sermon notes. Fortunately, the December 14th Morning and Evening services were included. Rev. Sivewright served at Main Street Baptist from 1933 until his death in 1947.

The morning message was titled "The Book of Books". He indicated "*Bibles in red, white, and blue on display*". He also references the "Bible Week" editorial in the Binghamton Press cited at the beginning of this article. Here are a few excerpts from Rev. Sivewright's December 14th morning sermon:

"12/14/1941 AM Service "Book of Books" Universal Bible Sunday

"It's great when the Press which goes into the hands of the believer and the unbeliever, is not afraid to publish an editorial about the Word of God"

"This is the only book ever written by the finger on God. This book makes great claims about itself-"

"A department store in England ordered 100,000 copies of the Bible, after they had sold so many copies. This is the largest single order of the Bible known-"

"Great religious organization have been asking the president to appoint a day of prayer-. God has asked us to give our substance. About 40% of this people gave last Sunday. It's too late now. The world cried and asked, "Help us, for God's sake".

Last year alone, more money was spent for chewing gum than [sic?] in the U.S.A. than was given by all denominations, Catholics included, towards missions in foreign countries".

"No man ever became impoverished, that they gave God a tenth. Isn't that strange!"

"You could pour all the wealth of the Morgans and the Rockefellers into this thing, but it wouldn't do any good now. God asked for his people to sacrifice. You wouldn't do it. I'm talking to Christians now, who absolutely squandered the portion of your earnings, instead of giving to the Lord."

At the end he posed he questions: "Have you looked in the Book? Do you believe in it? Are you standing on it? The world hasn't anything to cling to."
