



Summer Schedule for Church

Most of our Sunday activities will continue throughout the summer with the exception of the Evening Service.

The evening bible study service began with I Samuel 1 on September 12, 2021 and concluded with the last chapter, I Samuel 31 on June 26th. Diane Runion provided homemade desserts for the finale. Pastor Luke's Sunday School class on church history commenced on June 5th with 11 people attending. The class has been averaging 9 students since then. Starting with the Book of Acts the class will trek through the next 2000 years of Christian history. Pastor Luke presents the events in an interesting and understandable way. Questions are always welcomed. The class meets in the old youth room on Sundays at 10 AM.

History need not be dry as parchment either. There are plenty of fascinating people and events to learn about such as Bishop Cyprian of Carthage and the lapsed Christians of the 3rd century. Or the 16th Century uprising of a polygamous Anabaptist sect led by Jan van Leyden in Münster, Germany.

In our library, there are books, DVDs and CDs about Christian History and its contribution to healthcare, education, missions, society, and the arts.

The Thursday Evening Bible Study will continue for the next few weeks and possibly longer!

HEAL AFRICA IN GOMA -

Ann Clemmer's report -

1. Sunday School programs average about 850 children each Sunday and has led to : Leadership Training, weekly Bible Study, and special programs like VBS.
2. Classes for children who cannot attend school because of tuition fees: Music Theory, Literacy, English, Computer Science with a lab, Art, Dance, Musical instruments , and children's choir.
3. Programs for parents: Parenting classes (always a waiting list), exercise class, a Village Savings and Loan Program to benefit cottage industries, literacy and English classes, and a startup for financially struggling parents.
4. New program for homeless children called “Enfants Bien Aimes” (dearly beloved children): teaching about Jesus; counseling; personal care – clothing, food, places for safe bathing, a place to stay; and a day program and emergency shelter are being built.

“What started as just one Sunday school with about 200 children has grown as God keeps opening doors! Stay tuned.”

Those of you who have been here at Main Street Baptist for a while know about Rhaylene as our missionary in Kodiak, Alaska through Interact ministries. She is still receiving support from us in our Missions budget and a friend recently wrote that she is content and doing well and is in assisted living, having dementia. CHILD EVANGELISM FELLOWSHIP-Breadbox recipient for July
Our church has been exploring working with Child Evangelism Fellowship in teaching a Good News Club. This is an after-school program in which kids who are students at Horace Mann school around the corner would be attending at their school. Most years, we collect money through our Breadbox offering during July to help fund the local organization. There are several clubs around the

area at which children are taught a Bible lesson, have a song time and Scripture memory and mission story time, and have other activities around the lesson's theme. Every club includes strong discipleship training to build character and strengthen moral and spiritual growth and to possibly get them established in a local church. HISTORY NEWS A look back 10 years ago - 2012

In this month's Missions Notes, Diane gave updates on the Clemmers and Rhaylene Abbey. Ten years ago they were featured in our bulletins and news letters.

◇ In April 2012 the Main Street Baptist Prayer Concern was for Ann and Bill Clemmer: Missionaries to the new country of South Sudan. (South Sudan had just become an independent country in July 2011). The April 2012 Artery had the following information: *"Dr. Bill and Ann have relocated to South Sudan after 16 years of service in the Democratic Republic of Congo. Bill a physician serves as country representative for International Ministries' partner IMA World Health, working with a team from six African nations to help establish primary health care services for an estimated 4 million persons. Anne supports communications, logistics, and the needs of Sudanese health care workers."*

In the June 2012 Artery Missions Report – *"Please be in prayer for the Clemmers our American Baptist Missionaries serving in the South Sudan. Less than 1 year after South Sudan celebrated its independence from Sudan, these two nations are on the brink of war, it will cause unimaginable suffering for countless innocent civilians. Prayer is needed for the safety of many."*

The October 07, 2012 bulletin had an American Baptist World Mission Offering insert featuring Anne and Bill's work in South Sudan.

◇ Rhaylene Abbey, spoke during the September 9, 2012 evening service about her missionary work in Alaska.
