Pastoral Reading, Congregational Response

A Psalm of David.

¹ Save me, O God!

For the waters have come up to my neck.

² I sink in deep mire, where there is no foothold;

I have come into deep waters, and the flood sweeps over me.

³ I am weary with my crying out; my throat is parched.

My eyes grow dim with waiting for my God.

⁴ More in number than the hairs of my head are those who hate me without cause;

mighty are those who would destroy me, those who attack me with lies.

What I did not steal must I now restore?

⁵ O God, you know my folly; the wrongs I have done are not hidden from you.

⁶ Let not those who hope in you be put to shame through me, O Lord God of hosts;

let not those who seek you be brought to dishonor through me, O God of Israel.

⁷ For it is for your sake that I have borne reproach,

dishonor has covered my face.

⁸ I have become a stranger to my brothers,

an alien to my mother's sons.

⁹ For zeal for your house has consumed me,

and the reproaches of those who reproach you have fallen on me.

¹⁰ When I wept and humbled my soul with fasting,

but it became my reproach.

¹¹ When I made sackcloth my clothing,

¹² I am the talk of those who sit in the gate,

and the drunkards make songs about me.

¹³ But as for me, my prayer is to you, O Lord.
