

Lewis & Mere Christianity" by Paul McCusker. The BBC tried to make sense of their listeners' pain and loss by encouraging C.S. Lewis to articulate God's truth in a series of talks on the radio station that spoke to the average man and woman. MARCH BREADBOX - LIFE CHOICES CENTER

Life Choices Center has been an influence for many years in the lives of those who find themselves facing an unplanned pregnancy. The office is on Oak Street across from Binghamton High School and it does many things: First it provides an opportunity to see the couples' baby with ultrasound technology, then provides counseling, pregnancy checkups, and help with material needs. Life Choices Center also has opportunities to speak in assemblies in the schools, talking about abstinence as the primary and best prevention of unwanted pregnancies. They also counsel those who have had abortions telling of God's forgiveness, love, and restoration. During the month of March we will tell of a new program for expectant fathers called, Doctor Dad. During the last couple of years, the organization has had financial stresses and opposition by many who support Planned Parenthood and other abortion centers.

CHOSEN PEOPLE MINISTRIES

The Israeli Support Staff of Chosen People Ministries has been serving their military by giving out hundreds of supplies to those in cold-weather zones that includes socks, thermal underwear, water packs, sleeping bags and lights to wear on the helmets to see at night. One of the most meaningful aids was providing fresh, home-cooked food. They are also helping with Israelis forced to evacuate their homes on the northern and southern borders by partnering with faithful, Bible-believing organizations, one of which covered the cost of the enterprise. Children are especially affected by having had to flee their homes, as they have lost a couple of months of schooling, and many only have one parent in attendance on them. Many young parents have been mobilized to the reserve force. Chosen People has provided many of the children with tablet devices to use for their education. Holocaust survivors, too afraid to leave their houses, have been given food to sustain them. Hearts are shattered and the workers' generosity has stimulated many conversations about the Lord. Pray for peace in Jerusalem and for the peace that passes understanding through Christ.
