MISSIONS

BREADBOX OFFERINGS-In future, you will see fewer breadbox offerings, which is over and above missions giving. They will no longer be every month, but for the most part, once a quarter, and include ministries that we don't actively support in our budget. The reason you can probably guess, but...here goes. Money isn't coming in for the budget as well as it was, leaving us with a deficit that we've had to remedy by taking from a fund established for helping finance ministries at our church. We always try to take a faith-based use of the funds you've given us for outreach to local ministries, national, and international, but now we realize finances are tight for everyone. This is God's work to spread His Good News to all, and we rely on His wisdom and guidance. The breadbox offering may be drawing attention and money from our budgetary items. Once a month, we will have a Mission Minute to detail one of our ministries in the budget to give a broader view of the scope of the organization. If needs arise from other ministries, we will try to plug them in to a Breadbox offering.

When giving to Missions, please be aware that you need to designate from the General church giving which pays salaries, maintains the church, purchases needed equipment, and pays utilities. The weekly giving envelopes have a designation already, but if giving a check separately, it must be designated to Missions if it is to go there, or cash can be placed in the Breadbox offering envelopes in the seat back.
