All proceeds will go to the boiler fund. Sign ups will be 3/9 & 3/16.

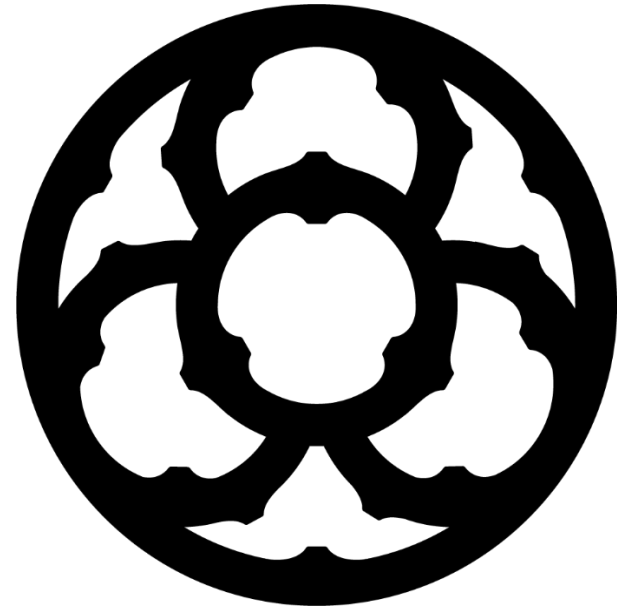
March 25th, Pastor's Book Club, 10AM, in the Green Room. St. Patrick's *Confession & Letter to Coroticus*.
