

### Apostles' Creed

I believe in God the Father Almighty, Maker of heaven and earth: And in Jesus Christ, his only Son our Lord; Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, Born of the Virgin Mary, Suffered under Pontius Pilate, Was crucified, dead, and buried; The third day he rose again from the dead, He ascended into heaven. And sitteth at the right hand of God the Father Almighty; From thence he shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, The holy catholic\* church, The communion of saints, The forgiveness of sins, The resurrection of the body, And the life everlasting. Amen

<sup>\*</sup> catholic means both "universal" and "according to the whole." To believe in the holy catholic church is to believe in one universal body of Christ encompassing all true Christians from all times and places which is built according to the whole witness of the Apostles, i.e. the entirety of the Scriptures.

#### Three Days with the Lord

At the feeding of the four thousand the crowd was with Jesus for three straight days. What would it look like for us to be actively present with the Lord in a similar way? Here are some ideas:

- Attend as many Holy Week services as you are able. The crowd was with Jesus together. This week gives us a chance to do this as a crowd as well. (This is short notice. Don't stress about missing a service).
- Devote your free time to the Lord. Let's all try to read the Gospel of Mark in its entirety. Got more time? Read through the Psalms. Not a big reader? Listen to audio versions.
- Devote more time to prayer. Daunting, I know. Pick a psalm, read a verse, and turn it into a prayer, apply it to your prayer list. Books like *Praying the Bible* and *Spiritual Disciplines for the Christian Life* both by Donald Whitney are helpful here.
- Read some classic works of Christian literature. Try to pick older things that have already stood the test of time. A few ideas: John Bunyan's *Pilgrim's Progress*, Augustine's *Confessions*, or (not as old) Chesterton's *Orthodoxy*, or Lewis' *Mere Christianity*. (Come see me for more adventurous ideas).
- Don't forget the kids! Read to them. C.S. Lewis' *The Lion, the Witch, and the Wardrobe* is fantastic. There are also versions of *Pilgrim's Progress* like *Little Pilgrim's Progress* by Helen L. Taylor and *Little Pilgrim's Big Journey* by Tyler Van Halteren.
- Do something to love your neighbor.
- Incorporate a fast. If you are physically able this is great way to aid prayer and to remember our dependance upon our Triune God. Follow the Lord's instructions in Matthew 6:16-18. No one should know you're doing it except whomever normally feeds you. Don't waste their time and effort. Don't turn it into a big deal. Whether you skip one meal or three days' worth, pick something(s) for which to pray. When you hunger, pray. Devote those mealtimes to Bible reading and prayer. Maybe give the approximate cost of the missed meals to the poor.
