Recently I've been reading the work *Hints of the Glory of Christ*¹ from the eighteenth century, British Baptist, Anne Dutton (1692-1765). She was a thoughtful theologian, a prolific hymn writer, and a remarkable Christian woman. This little book, written as a letter to a friend, shows where Christ is to be found in Song of Solomon 5:10-16.

She has attached this poem to the beginning of her work which shows she intended this commentary to be evangelistic in nature. How many of us run to the Song of Solomon when we wish to share the gospel with our friends? In this opening poem alone, you can see Anne's love for her Heavenly Bridegroom as well as her heart for her unbelieving friend. May we all be as zealous for our LORD and the lost. — Pastor Luke

To Mr. *E. H.* IR, as the after Letter, to you l've sent, These Lines before it, 1 likewise present.²

My Friend, read of a *Friend*, that doth all friends exceed: A Friend, that loves His, in all Times of Need: A Friend, whose Kindness and his Truth never fails; A Friend, whose Power and Interest ever prevails. Read of a Bridegroom, that doth all excel: And may you, with the Virgins, love him well! May you, with Salem's Daughters, seek him too: And never rest, till Christ, as yours, you know! And may the Spirit, to you Christ's Glory shew, By some one Line, your Friend did write for you! How blest would be that Morn, that Day how bright, If Christ, and you, were joined in Love's Delight! Were you so *joined*, that you might never *part*; 'Twould be the Joy, and Gladness of my Heart. Oh! Might He have you, as his Bride: Then I, As the Bridegroom's Friend, should joy exceedingly! To endear your Soul to Him: This is my End, In what, from the Spouse's Lips, for you, I penned. And might I see you married to the LORD, 'Twould be my Life, my Crown, my great Reward! Read then, my Friend, This Story of Christ's Love: Who knows but the Spirit, may tell you it from above? If while you read Christ's Beauties, *Him* you spy: 'Twill make you happy to Eternity! For his sweet Bridegroom, is filled with Love to the Brim: And lets none die, who fall in Love with Him: To them, he gives himself, his Life, his Store! And makes them *blest*, both now, and evermore!
