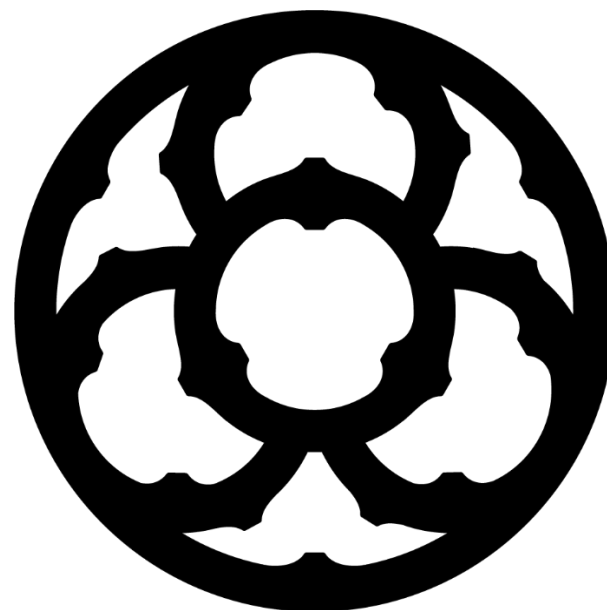

and shout for joy, all you upright in heart!

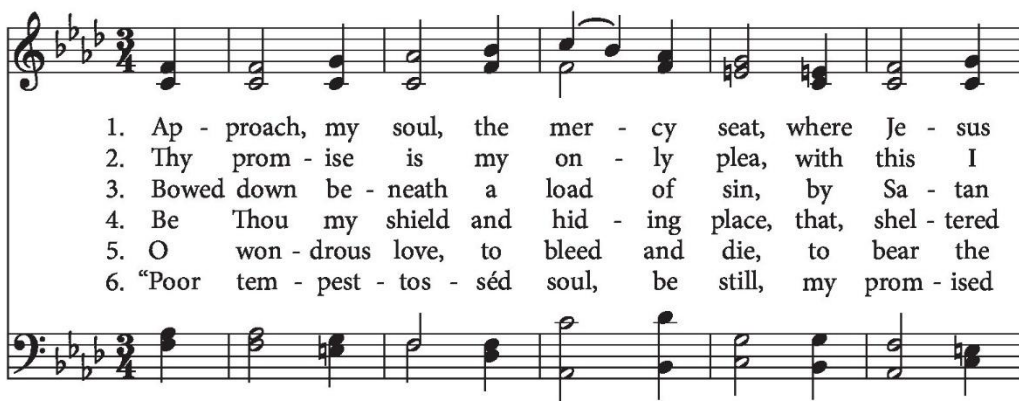

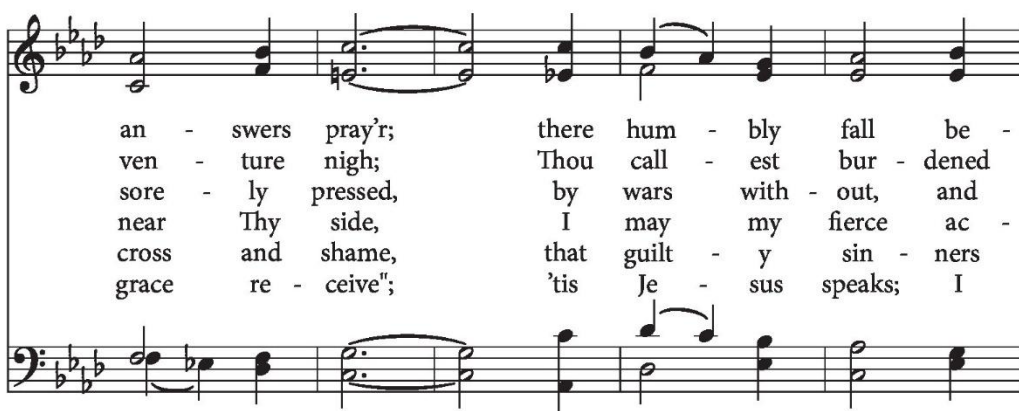
