

Pastoral Reading, **Congregational Response**

¹ As a deer pants for flowing streams,

so pants my soul for you, O God.

² My soul thirsts for God, for the living God.

When shall I come and appear before God?

³ My tears have been my food day and night,

while they say to me all the day long, "Where is your God?"

⁴ These things I remember, as I pour out my soul:

how I would go with the throng and lead them in procession to the house of God

with glad shouts and songs of praise,

a multitude keeping festival.

⁵ Why are you cast down, O my soul,

and why are you in turmoil within me?

Hope in God;

for I shall again praise him, my salvation and my God.

My soul is cast down within me;

therefore I remember you from the land of Jordan and of Hermon, from Mount Mizar.

⁷ Deep calls to deep at the roar of your waterfalls;

all your breakers and your waves have gone over me.

⁸ By day the Lord commands his steadfast love, **and at night his song is with me, a prayer to the God of my life.**
