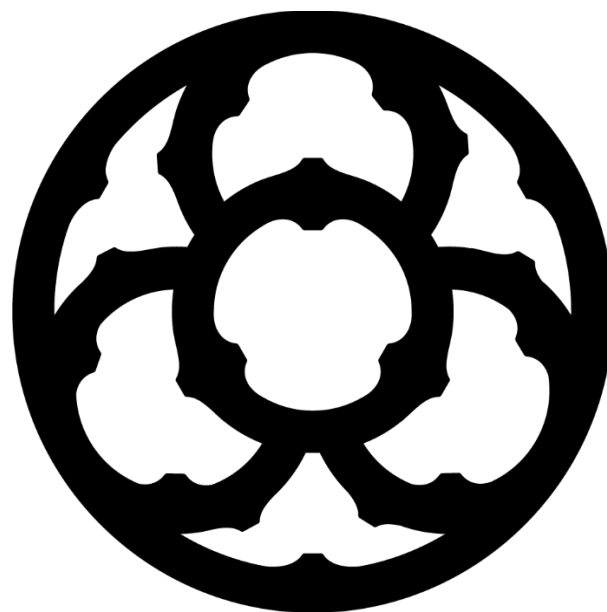

¹⁶ In place of your fathers shall be your sons;

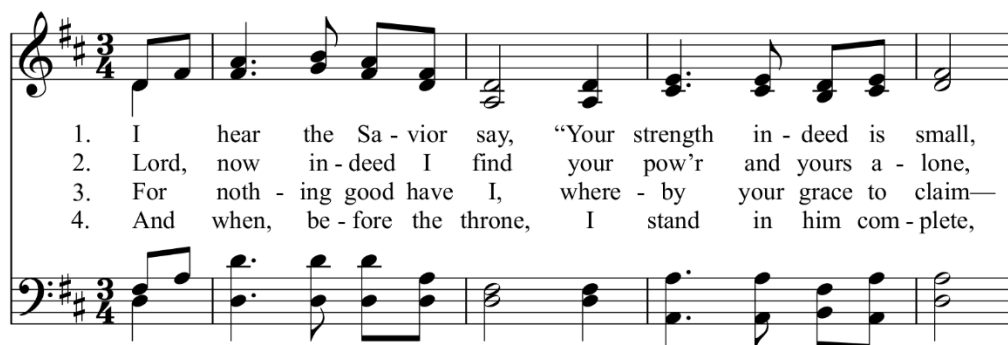
you will make them princes in all the earth.

¹⁷ I will cause your name to be remembered in all generations;

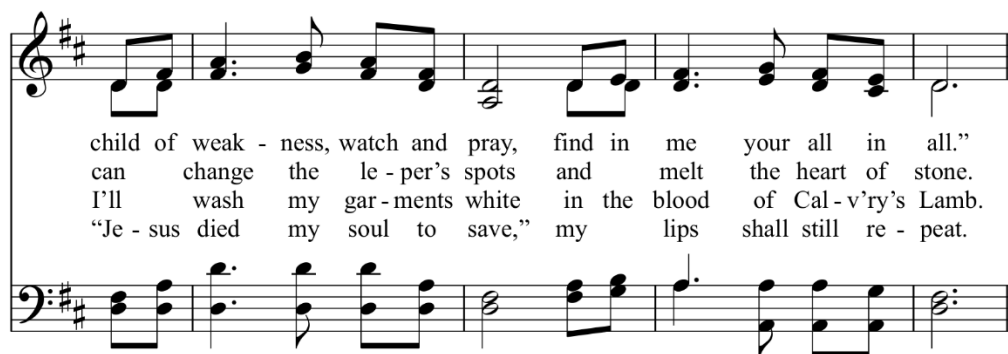

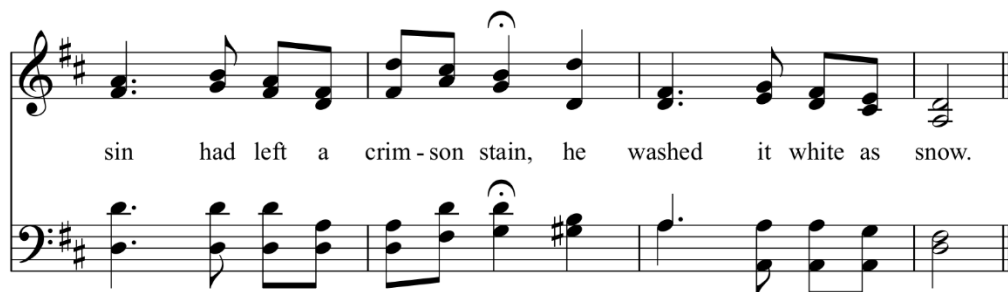
